The design, proposed by Tommy Tragle, will consist of the club's name, "est. 1967", and the motto "Dedicated to the Preservation of Maritime Heritage" at the top, along with a line drawing of the MONITOR and MERRIMAC. The saying "Knowledge is of No Value Until Shared With Others" will run across the bottom, and blue ink on white paper will be used.

Guests Tom Hesse and Ed Swanson were voted in as members at this meeting. A course in Nautical Archaeology, to be held at the Mariners' Museum, was discussed and recommended. Paris Aiken announced that the club scrapbook is now organized up to 1980. Bill Fox passed an advance copy of his new book Always Good Ships around and promised to bring members' copies to the next meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 2117.
