Old Business

NRG Conference- No changes to report. Preparations are proceeding nicely.

New Business

Ship Modeling Presentation The presentation is confirmed for the 22nd of July. Len Wine will coordinate the presenters and make arrangements with Martha Stewart of the museum. At least six members expressed interest in making presentations.

A Day in the Park- The Mariners' Museum is celebrating its 65th anniversary this year. As part of the celebration there will be a Day in the Park on 17 and 18 June. The Hampton Roads Ship Model Society headlines this time so we'll need great club member participation. We will be doing a static display as well display as well as operating R/C models.

New Business

Newport News Centennial-Bill Fox received an inquiry from the city of Newport News wondering if the club would be interested in participating in an event next year commemorating the city's centennial. They mentioned a possible model exhibit, possibly in conjunction with The Mariners' Museum. There was cautious interest among the members.

The Mariners' Museum Model Contest- Six HRSMS members have models in this years contest. The judges were Dana Wegner, Rob Napier and Bill Wilkinson. Alan Fraser mentioned that the judges had a very busy week doing the judging, ending on June 8, and everyone said the competition this year was especially tough. The were 30 medals awarded. Our members did very well. Both Bob Comet and Jack Bobbitt received Silver medals. Jack also was awarded a Bronze medal and won the NRG's Chapelle award for the second time. John Cheevers, Joe McCleary, Graham Home and Ulrich Guenther all received Certificates of Commendation. There were 87 models entered this year including 2 from Tokyo, Japan.

Show and Tell

Jack Bobbitt- Jack brought along some very nice square punches. (Ed. Note: I forgot to write down where Jack obtained them. I'll find out and put it into next month's newsletter.)

Jack also had his block rounding machine. Recall last issue when Jim McCurdy brought along his machine. Jack's device uses a medicine jar turned by a small motor. Inside the jar is a waterwheel made out out of sandpaper and the jar itself is also lined with sandpaper. The machine will round the corners off of a set of blocks in about 20 seconds.

Finally, Jack showed us some Japanese maple which he obtained from his sisters tree. As Jack put it, "This is very, very hard wood."

John Cheevers- John had along a couple of more volumes of the <u>Practical Shipbuilding</u> set of books. These books were published in 1957 and are Danish in origin, translated into English. They are very complete and The Mariners' Museum has a set in its library.






