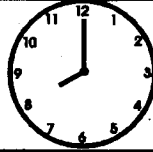

De Zeven Provinces-

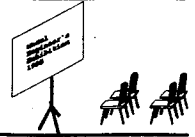
Henry Schekulin brought along a set of plans of this ship done by a Dutch researcher. The plans are very well done and very well researched. Their is a companion book available.

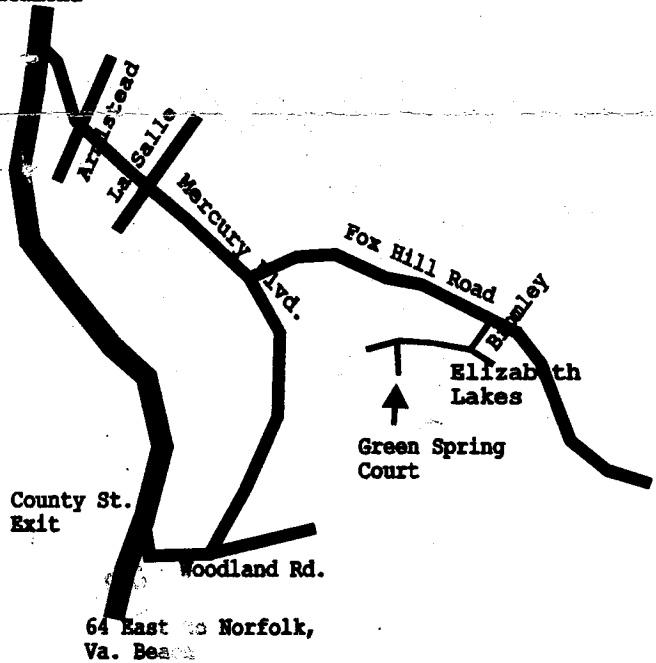
Next Meeting

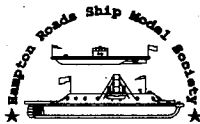
