Jack covered the sources for civilian sail plans. The best source in the US is the catalog from the Smithsonian. It is also worthwhile to check with the various maritime museums as they usually have their own collections. Plans are also available from the National Maritime Museum in England.

Bill's topic was steel navy. The best source is the National Archives for plans and photos. There are also some mail order vendors and again the various maritime museums.

Joe covered sailing warship plans. The Smithsonian has a catalog and the Archives also carries some plans. Again, museums can be a good source.

Metunga- Jack has finished the Metunga and brought the model along for everyone to see.

Microtorch- Joe McCleary brought along a microtorch made in China that uses a Bic lighter as the fuel source. It is marketed by Leichtung.

Eagle- Joe also had the Eagle along to show.

The meeting adjourned at 2203 to refreshments provided by Chuck and Linda Reynolds. This month we were pushing south into NC, next month we trek into the far western reaches of the state, the other side of Richmond.

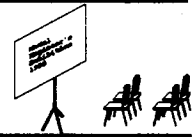
Here's a list of topics for the upcoming Steel Navy seminar:

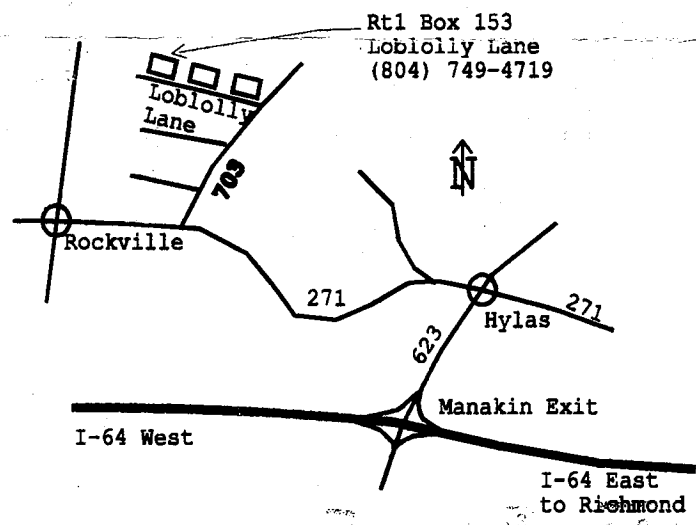

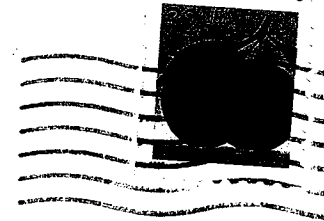
