Kent Wade regretfully announced that the Richmond Ship Model Society had suspended operations for an indefinite period. Purser Bill Fox reminded the members of the Forbes toy boat exhibit at the Virginia Beach Life Saving Museum. Bob Moritz was elected and welcomed into the society.

The meeting was adjouned at 2125 by Skipper Bill Clarke.
